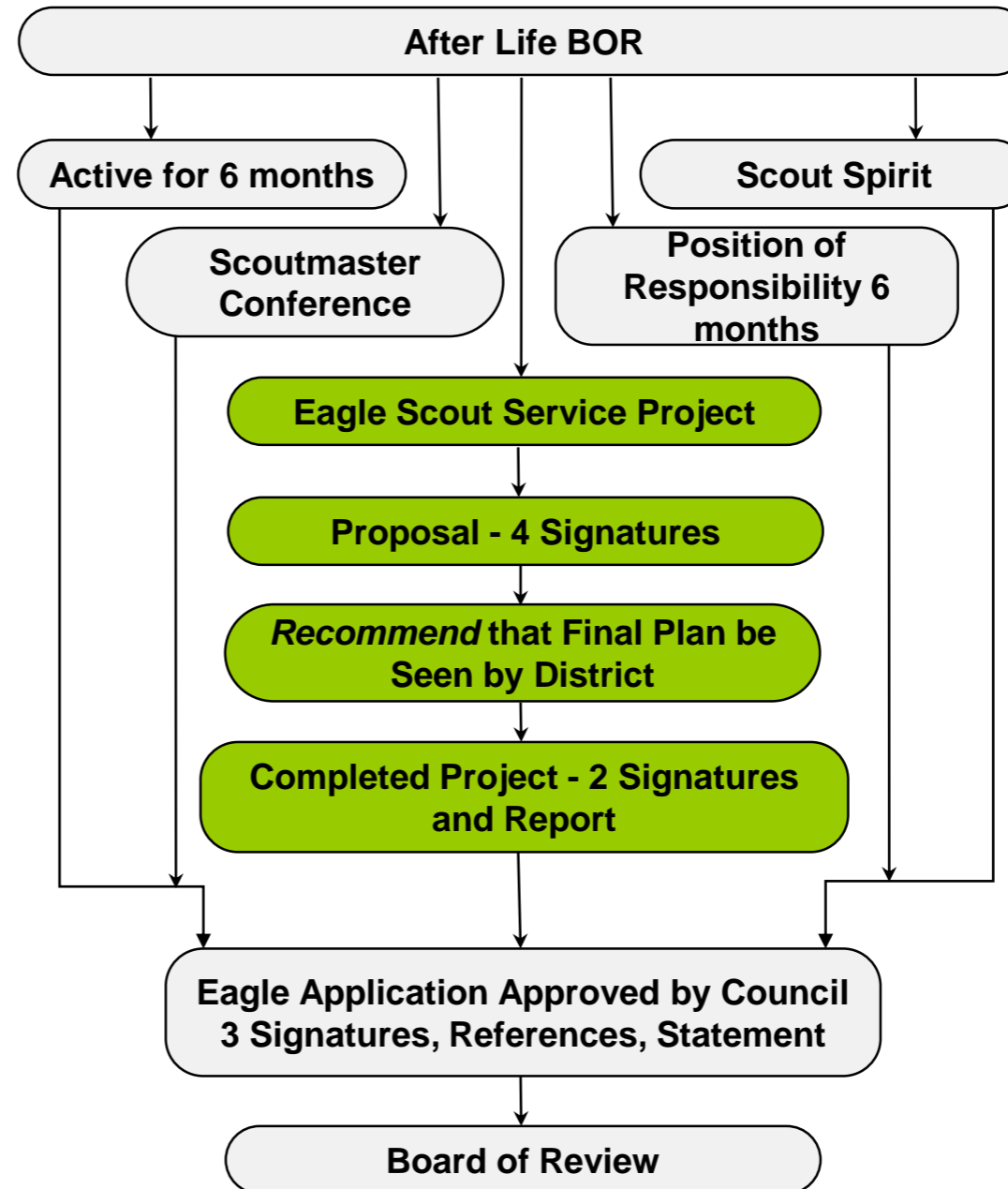

Eagle Scout Service Project

While a Life Scout, plan, develop, and give leadership to others is a service project helpful to any religious institution, any school, or your community. (The project must benefit an organization other than Boy Scouting.) A project proposal must be approved by the organization benefiting from the effort, your unit leader and unit committee, and the council or district before you start. [You must use the Eagle Scout Service Project Workbook](#), No. 512-927, in meeting this requirement.

--Eagle Scout requirement 5

Important Project Steps

- Four signatures on the Proposal *required before* starting the Final Plan
 - District signature is last
- District *wants* to see the Final Plan *before* the project begins, with enough time for corrections as necessary
- The Eagle Designee who signs the Proposal *should* be the one to sit on the Board of Review

Not Eagle Projects

- Fundraisers alone.
- Routine Labor.
- (Blood Drives, etc.
– but depends on amount of leadership on the part of the scout.)

Project Proposal

The proposal is an overview, but also the *beginnings* of planning. It shows the unit leader and any representatives of a unit committee or district that the following tests can be met.

- The project provides sufficient opportunity to meet the requirement.
- The project appears to be feasible.
- Safety issues will be addressed.
- Action steps for further detailed planning are included.
- The Scout is on the right track with a reasonable chance for a positive experience.

Fundraising Application

- Page 3-8 in the Workbook
- Not necessary when:
 - Only asking Scout's troop, sponsor and family
 - And/or beneficiary's members and family
 - Receiving material donations
- Must be approved & signed by Eagle Designee

Questions

- Is there a minimum numbers of hours required for projects? [No. Must be large enough to show adequate planning & leadership.]
- Can two Life Scouts share the same project? [No. Planning & execution must be separate, however projects may be “adjacent” or consecutive.]
- Must a project be “significant” or have “lasting value?” [No. Adequate leadership must be shown.]

Adult Roles

- **Eagle Designee**
 - A member of the Northern Trail District Advancement committee, specifically designated for this role. He/she represents the Council.
- **Eagle Coach**
 - Assigned by the Unit.
- **Eagle Advisor / Advancement Chair/co-chair**
 - Assigned by the Unit.
- **Chairman of Eagle Board of Review**
 - Assigned by the Unit.

Role of Eagle Designee

- Review & approve the Project Proposal.
This is an opportunity to coach.
 - Represent the Council at the Board of Review.
- *District does not approve Final Plans.*
It is good to review the final plan before the project is carried out; this is not required.

Role of Project Coach

- The coach is the key to success in guiding scouts through the service project process
- Offer advice
- Emphasize things that could create health or safety issues.
- Teach critical path issues (Gantt charts) and work planning (WBS or similar)

Role of Project Coaches

- Remind the scout to share the Final Plan with the project beneficiary
- Act as a consultant
- Review the Final Plan and make suggestions - point out strengths, weaknesses and risks
- Offer advice on how to make a strong presentation at the Board of Review.
May not be a member of the board.
- Might also be the Eagle Advisor.

Role of Eagle Advisor, Advancement (co-)Chair

- Track & encourage scout's progress on Merit Badges and Leadership positions.
- Ensure Project Proposal & Plan are completed correctly.
- Secure Council approval of Eagle Application & submit final, signed application to Council.
- May not be a member of the Eagle Board of Review.
- Might also serve as Eagle Coach.

Role of Chairman of Eagle Board of Review

- Schedule Eagle Board of Review & check references.
May delegate this. In many troops, the Advisor or Advancement chair handles this.
- Conduct the Eagle Board of Review.
Frequently shared with Designee.
- Sign the approved Eagle Application.

Important Application Steps

- Application must be filled out, signed and approved by Council *before* the Board of Review can be *scheduled*
- Take or Email the Application and the Council Advancement Report to either Council office.
 - Your Eagle Designee can help with this.

AGE REQUIREMENT ELIGIBILITY. Merit badges, badges of rank, and Eagle Palms may be earned by a registered Boy Scout, Varsity Scout, Venturer, or Sea Scout. He may earn these awards until his 18th birthday. Any Venturer or Sea Scout who achieved the First Class rank as a Boy Scout in a troop or Varsity Scout in a team may continue working for the Star, Life, and Eagle Scout ranks and Eagle Palms while registered as a Venturer or Sea Scout up to his 18th birthday. Scouts, Venturers, and Sea Scouts who have completed all requirements prior to their 18th birthday may be reviewed within three months after that date with no explanation. Refer to the Guide to Advancement, No. 33088, section 8.0.3.1, for boards of review to be held between three and six months, or more than six months after the 18th birthday.

A Scout, Venturer, or Sea Scout with a disability may work toward rank advancement after he is 18 years of age if he meets the criteria for registration beyond the age of eligibility. See the Guide to Advancement, section 10.0.0.0, for details.

AGE REQUIREMENT ELIGIBILITY Merit badges, badges of rank, and Eagle Palms may be earned by a registered Boy Scout, Varsity Scout, or Venturer. He may earn these awards until his 18th birthday. Any Venturer who achieved the First Class rank as a Boy Scout in a troop or Varsity Scout in a team may continue working for the Star, Life, and Eagle Scout ranks and Eagle Palms while registered as a Venturer up to his 18th birthday. Scouts and Venturers who have completed all requirements prior to their 18th birthday may be reviewed within three months after that date with no explanation. Boards of review conducted between three and six months after the candidate's 18th birthday must be pre-approved by the local council. A statement by an adult explaining the reason for the delay must be attached to the Eagle Scout Rank Application when it is submitted to the Eagle Scout Service. The Boy Scout Division at the national office must be contacted for procedures to follow if a board of review is to be conducted more than six months after a candidate's 18th birthday.

 - This is obtained by the unit, not the scout.
- In Northern Trail, Boards of Review are scheduled and held at the unit level.
- An Eagle Designee from Northern Trail must represent the Council at the Board of Review.
 - This should be the one who approved the Project, but this is not required.

What the Scout should bring to the Board of Review

- Approved Eagle Scout Application (provided by the unit)
- Boy Scout Handbook and/or any and all material showing completion of requirements
- Eagle Scout Project Workbook including all signatures, the Final Report. Photos are great, but optional.
- **REQUIREMENT 6.** Take part in a unit leader conference. Attach to this application a statement of your ambitions and life purpose and a listing of positions held in your religious institution, school, camp, community, or other organizations during which you demonstrated leadership skills. Include honors and awards received during this service.
